One area that needed to develop depth, and rather quickly, for the University of South Dakota football team was unquestionably the receiving corp.

Without last year's leading pass-catcher and with two of the top returners banged up with injury, the Coyotes spent the three weeks of spring practices trying to find a handful of new faces who could consistently haul in passes.

If Saturday afternoon's spring game production was any indication, USD might have just found a couple of other weapons. With a system geared to big offensive numbers, the Coyote offense beat its defensive counterparts 48-21 at the annual game held at the DakotaDome.

"We see them every day in practice, so we're pretty used to what they do, but we opened it up a lot, and everyone really played well," said sophomore Ben Kramer, who led the receivers with 120 yards and two scores — on 30 yards and 59 yards.

"Four touchdowns from us is huge."

And rather necessary. With the rushing game held to 38 yards on 28 carries, the Coyotes opened up the playbook for junior quarterback Kevin Earl. He completed 17-of-35 passes for 335 yards and four scores.

Earl was given a group that was down Josh Vander Maten (injury) and last year's leading receiver Terrance Terry (who is graduating early), while sophomore Riley Donovan (who caught two passes Saturday) battled through injury this spring.

"The receiving group definitely needed help, especially with Terrance not coming back this year," Kramer said. "It's big for us to get in there and start making some plays."

The way head coach Joe Glenn saw it, stacking the box to stop the run was, for the most part, successful for the defense, but there were consequences — "You live by the sword, you die by it," was how the veteran coach put it.

"Our defense threw everything and the kitchen sink to stop the running game because they knew what we were going to try to do," Glenn said. "And then did a pretty good job."

"But they gave up some touchdowns over the top."

It wasn't all bad for the defense, though.

On the first five drives of the game, the defense forced a punt, intercepted two passes, recovered a fumble and forced the offense to make a 42-yard field goal.

That's when Earl and Co. got rolling. Earl hit Kramer for a 30-yard touchdown, then found redshirt freshman receiver Sam Cooke for a 15-yard score, and on the next series stepped up from pressure to find Kramer for a 59-yard touchdown.

For Glenn and the coaching staff, seeing Kramer — an Ottumwa, IA, native — rise to the occasion was not a surprise.

"He showed that all spring; he had a breakout spring," Glenn said. "He's a good recruit for us, and he's starting to show what he can do."

The offense closed the scoring with a 37-yard field goal from sophomore Miles Bergner and a 13-yard touchdown completion from Earl to junior receiver Nick Meyer.

In all on the day, Meyer caught a team-high four passes for 39 yards, while Kramer and redshirt Brandt Van Roekel both had three catches. Donovan had two receptions, while redshirt freshman Khorey Kilgore,

Cooke, junior transfer Eric Shufford, sophomore Trevor Bouma and sophomore Matt Miller all had one.

"Huge progress over the last three weeks; huge," Earl said of that group. "These guys have gained a lot of confidence."

"They believe they can go up and make the play, and when they believe that, I do too."

Eventually, though, the Coyotes will get Vander Maten (a converted quarterback) back to full strength and Donovan will assume his role as a top playmaker. From there, it'll be a battle to fill the other spots, Van Roekel said.

"We've been working hard really all spring, and we know it'll be a battle come fall," he said. "I'm just going to keep working hard and getting used to the position, and see where I fit in on the team."

The Coyote defense had three interceptions in all, one each from sophomore Zeke Lewis, sophomore Devon O'Farrell and junior transfer Chris Tyler.
