Reddy named to Academic All-League Team

University of South Dakota junior Yamini Reddy was named to the 2014 Summit League Women's Tennis Academic All-Summit League Team via league release on Tuesday.

Athletes named to the team were chosen based on their academic and athletic performances from this season and were voted on by the Faculty Athletic Representatives and Sports Information Directors from the league's eight member institutions.

Reddy, who has a 3.66 GPA in contemporary media and journalism and business administration, was named to the team for the second straight year. She was 13-7 in singles play this season with nine wins coming in straight sets. She also added nine wins in doubles play.

To be eligible for the team, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.30 or better (on a 4.0 scale), completed one full academic year at their current institution and participated in at least 50 percent of their team's competitions.

Atlanta signs on Starr

Tyler Starr is taking his talents to Georgia.

Starr (6-5, 250), the record-setting linebacker from the University of South Dakota, was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in the seventh round (255th overall) of the NFL Draft on Saturday.

Starr, who spent the day in his hometown of Little Rock, Iowa, with his family, was the second to last player taken. He left Sunday for Atlanta.

"This is an unreal feeling," Starr said in a statement. "We waited all day long for this to happen, and when it did we were overwhelmed. My son, Hunter, turns three (Sunday) and it was great to celebrate this day with him. I fly to Atlanta soon and I can't wait to get started."

Starr led the MVFC in sacks (9.0), tackles for loss (15.0) and forced fumbles (4) this past season. He finished second on the team in tackles with 71. He also had an interception and was credited with four pass breakups. During his three seasons in Vermillion, Starr accumulated 196 tackles, including a program record 27 sacks and 13 forced fumbles.

Starr's selection gives USD NFL draftees twice in a three-year span, as offensive lineman Tom Compton was picked by Washington in the sixth round (193rd overall) in 2012. Starr is the 13th Coyote taken in the NFL draft, and the first Coyote linebacker selected since Craig Austin was taken by the Seattle Seahawks in the 1982 draft.

Starr, however, wasn't the only Coyote player to hear from an NFL team over the weekend.

Cornerback Jarrid Bryant signed a free agent contract with the St. Louis Rams and offensive lineman Cody O'Neill was invited to the Minnesota Vikings minicamp.

For Bryant, a native of Corona, Calif., spent just one of

his five collegiate seasons on the defensive side of the ball. He transferred to USD last summer after spending four seasons – and graduating – at Arizona State.

"Me coming to USD, that's the whole reason I'm going to St. Louis," Bryant told the Press & Dakotan on Sunday. "Coach (Jason) Petrino let me play where I was comfortable, and it worked out well."

"Without them, this wouldn't be happening right now."

In one season with the Coyotes, the 6-foot-4 Bryant played in all 12 games and recorded two interceptions from his cornerback spot. He made 39 tackles and recovered one fumble.

Bryant said his relationship with the Rams organization began last fall when a scout would come to practice. The

team was then represented at USD's pro day in March.

Midway through the second round of the NFL Draft on Friday, Bryant said he received a call that the Rams were interested in either drafting Bryant or making a move as a free agent.

That phone call came five minutes after the draft concluded Saturday, he said.

"It was real easy decision," Bryant said. "I knew either way, they would be one of the teams I'd have to choose from, but I always felt like they would be a good fit."

And so, Bryant leaves today (Monday) for St. Louis, where he will spend five weeks with the Rams.

Getting to this point, though, has been emotional for Bryant, who referenced his (and his family's) faith as a key reason he

was able to devote so much time to football as a graduate student at USD.

"I did it the right way. I got the student part done in four years and now I'm blessed and fortunate enough to be in this situation," Bryant said. "I kept fighting, because in the end, I hoped it would all pay off."

O'Neill, a 6-foot-3, 305-pound offensive lineman from Harvard, Ill., started every game in the past two seasons helping a Coyote offense that rushed for 144.2 yards per game despite a number of banged-up running backs. The Coyote offensive line allowed just 20 sacks.

Billy Mount started off the offense by getting on base due to an error by the third baseman in the second inning. He scored when Travis Weber got a single. Weber advanced in scoring position when Regan Bye got a single. Weber and Bye both scored when Jayce Huska got another single and advanced to second base on an error.

The Watchdogs responded by scoring a single run in the top of the third inning. Lyle scored after getting on base by a walk, then be driven in by a single by Diefendorf. Beresford added two more runs in the fifth inning when Orr and Diefendorf were both advanced around the diamond.

The Tanagers responded in the bottom of the inning by taking Carter Kratz's opening single to advance him to the plate to end the scoring. The sixth and

seventh inning remained scoreless for the final of 4-3.

Vermillion's baseball schedule remains uncertain at press time. They will play the winner of the game between the Dakota Valley Panthers and the Bon Homme Cavaliers. If the Panthers beat the Cavaliers, the date and time will be announced. If the Cavaliers beat the Panthers, the Tanagers will travel to Tabor on Sunday, May 18.
