Travel volume expected to reach post-recession high

Memorial Day weekend is approaching, which can only mean one thing: The countdown to summer is on.

According to AAA's first travel forecast of the summer, 110,750 South Dakotans are projected to travel over Memorial Day, representing an increase of .4 percent – or 450 more travelers – compared to last year.

"Several key factors are driving the expectation for more holiday travelers this year," said Marilyn Buskohl, spokeswoman for AAA South Dakota. "As the economy continues to improve, disposable

income, consumer confidence and the employment outlook are trending up. This is welcome news for travelers as well as the travel industry."

Three trends from AAA's 2014 Memorial Day forecast among South Dakotans include:

Road trips remain strong. Nearly 105,100 South Dakotans – or 94 percent of holiday travelers – plan to drive to their destination. This represents an increase of .1 percent from last year. South Dakotans will pay \$3.535 per gallon to fill up before heading out of town this Memorial Day, compared to \$3.658 last year. Air travel experiences lift.

About 4,930 South Dakotans plan to fly to their Memorial Day destination. This represents an increase of .2 percent from last year.

Travel expenses rise modestly. South Dakotans will encounter slightly higher prices this Memorial Day weekend. Airfares are 6 percent higher, mid-range hotels are up 2 percent and car rentals are costing 1 percent more compared to last year.

Nationwide, 36.1 million Americans will be traveling over the long holiday weekend, an increase of 1.5 percent percent over Memorial Day, 2013.
