Tanager track athletes heading to State

CANTON – The host team won both the girls' (199 points) and boys' (191) team titles at the Region 4A track meet on May 22. The Tanager girls came in fourth with 80 points, while the boys finished in sixth place with 61

Several Vermillion athletes qualified to compete at the State A Track Meet in Madison on May 30, and at Howard Wood Field in Sioux Falls on May 31. Throughout the season, each athlete has had the opportunity to pre-qualify for state by reaching a designated standard (time, distance or height) set by the SDHSAA (South Dakota High School Athletic Association) before the season kicked off.

The regional meets were the last chance for anyone to qualify for State. The top two finishers in each event, regardless of the posted mark, have one more

week of competition. The only Tanagers to prequalify in individual events were Nick Jensen and Maddie Lavin. The girls' medley relay also prequalified before the regional

Rachel Finnegan finished in second place in the girls' 400 Meter Dash to advance to State (1:03.73). She will be running in lane six of heat one in Madison on Friday. The winner of each of the three heats, plus the next five best times, advance to the finals at 12:10 p.m. on Saturday. Alicia Brown of Vermillion set the State A Meet record in 2006 with a time of 56.69 seconds.

Maddie Lavin pre-qualified in two individual events. She has the third fasted qualifying time in the 1600 meter run (5:18.90) and will be running out of the third lane at 11 a.m. on Saturday. She owns the fasted qualifying time in the 3200 meter run (11:21.20), so she will be starting out of lane four at 5:05 p.m. on

The boys' Sprint Medley team of Jeremiah Johnson, Rylan Pratt, Jon Rosales, and Logan Peterson finished in second place with a time of 3:51.78 to advance to State. They will run out of the second lane of the first heat at 4 p.m. on Friday. The winners of each of the three heats, plus the next five fasted times advance to the finals at 1:25 p.m. on

Nick Jensen pre-qualified in the Shot Put with the second longest distance in the state (52° 11"). He will be the second-to-last competitor in flight two, with flight one starting at 9:30 a.m. on Friday. Nick will be battling Tyler

Lems of Canton for the championship.

Nick also qualified in the Discus Throw by finishing second at the regionals with a toss of 148' 10". He will be third in line of the second flight of the Discus Finals, with the first flight starting at 11:30 am on Saturday.

Other Tanagers that battled for a birth to State were Taylor Weber (13.83) and Ashley Schultz in the girls' 100-meter dash. Schultz ran a 13.14 in the prelims to qualify for the finals. Running a 13.40 left her in third place. The girls' 200-meter dash saw Asheley Schulz (29.17) and Taylor Weber (30.24) race around the curve.

Along with Rachel Finnegan qualifying for State in the 400meter dash with her time of 1:03.73, Katie Kost (1:05.07) and Anna Hackemer (1:06.98) were right behind in a tight field. Katie Kost (2:44.52) and Haliegh Melstad (2:47.31) came in in sixth and eighth places in the 800-meter run.

Maddie Mockler recorded 14' 7" in the long jump, and 25' 8.75" in the Triple Jump. Caitlin Siegel came in sixth (31' 0") in the shot put, while Kasey Jensen (26' 10") and Lexie Malimanek (21' 10") also competed. Siegel came in fourth (99' 11") in the discus throw, while Jensen threw 73' 0" and Malimanek threw 65'

The boys saw Matt Bierle (12.73), Andrew Pietrzak (13.35) and Tyler Hauck (15.77) in the 100-meter dash. Matt Bierle ran around the curve for the 200-meter dash in 25.74. Jon Rosales just missed out on an individual birth to state when he finished third in the 400 meter dash with a time of 53.85. Jeremiah Johnson finished right behind in fifth

place with a time of 54.16, while Jon Manning finished in

The 800-meter run saw Iames Butler finish in sixth place with a time of 2:14.35, while Parson Covington (2:23.36) and Cordell Sweeney (2:35.46) also competed. The 1600 meter run had Butler finish in fourth place (4:57.67), and Parson finished in 5:11.62. Justin Sorensen finished the 3200-meter run in 11:33.37.

The 4x100 meter relay team (Matt Bierle, Andrew Pietrzak, Josh Prescott, and Rylan Pratt) finished in fourth place with a time of 49.97. The same boys made up the 4x200 meter relay, which finished in sixth place with at time of 1:43.58. The future is bright for Tanager sprinting, since all four boys will be freshmen next year.

The 4x400 meter relay team (Jeremiah Johnson, Logan Peterson, James Butler and Jon Rosales) finished in fifth place with a time of 3:43.17. The 4x800 meter relay team (James Butler, Justin Sorensen, Parson Covington and Logan Peterson) was in fourth place with a time of 9:01.96.

The long jump saw Jay Munger in eighth place (17' 7.25") and Jon Manning in thirteenth (11' 2.25"). Jay Munger also came in at eighth place (34' 5.75") in the triple jump. Joining Nick Jensen in the shot put and discus was Noah Westergard, who put the shot 31' 11" and launched the discus 73' 5"
