Ken Versteeg, Executive Director, Community Blood Bank states, "Community Blood Bank uses 550 units of blood per week to meet the needs of patients within the local area. Donating blood is a very easy way to impact a patient's life."

Community Blood Bank is the sole provider of blood and blood products for 31 local hospitals including Sanford Vermil-

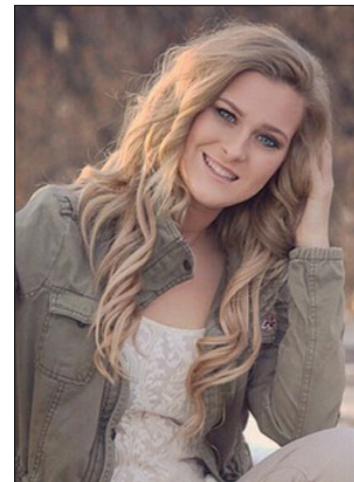
lion, Sanford Medical Center, Avera McKennan Hospital and the V.A. Medical Center. Community Blood Bank is not affiliated with other blood bank organizations and takes pride in being a self-sufficient organization, thanks to the generosity of our local blood donors.

Donors must be at least 17 years old (16 years old with a signed donor consent form found at cbbllifeblood.org), weigh 110 pounds or more and be in good general health the day of the donation. Please bring an ID with you. It is recommended that you eat and drink plenty of fluids before donating blood. It only takes 30 to 35 minutes to donate with Community Blood Bank. First Group of Four-Year BSN Graduates Receive Diplomas

The University of South Dakota's four-year Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing (BSN) graduates its first class of students since the four-year BSN program was re-instituted in 2013 by the SD Board of Regents.

Fifty-five four-year

BSN nursing students will receive their nursing pin on Friday, May 8 at USD nursing campuses in Vermillion and Sioux Falls. Graduation ceremonies are in Vermillion on Saturday, May 9 at the Dakota Dome.

USD Nursing in Vermillion

and Sioux Falls started BSN programming in fall 2013. USD nursing students in Rapid City were admitted to the four-year BSN program starting in 2014, and Pierre students can begin the program in fall, 2016.

USD Nursing offers other

professional options, including an online post licensure RN - BSN program. This program offers existing registered nurses the chance to earn their undergraduate degree in nursing. Fifty-five students will receive this degree on May 8.
