

Coyote women's basketball team announces 2010-11 recruits

Ryan Williams, the head women's basketball coach at The University of South Dakota, has announced the Coyotes' 2009 recruiting class. Nebraska prep stars Katelyn Edwards of Crete, NE, and Stacia Robertson of Grand Island, NE, have signed letters of intent to play for USD starting in 2010-11, while Carsey Barden, a standout from White-wood, will also continue her athletic and academic career at USD.

"We are very excited about this class," said Williams. "Katelyn, Stacia and Carsey will be huge impacts to our program's success. All three are very versatile and dynamic players who possess very good skill. These are very tough-minded and competitive kids who have been very well-coached throughout their high school and summer basketball careers."

Edwards, a 5-foot-11 senior guard at Crete High School, was named to the Class B All-State first team in 2009. She averaged 19.6 points, 10.5 rebounds, 4.3 steals and 2.9 assists in eight games before suffering an injury. Edwards shared the Dakota Showcase MVP honors with Robertson after helping the Nebraska Twisterz to the championship last summer. She was named the Lincoln Journal Star Super State first team as a sophomore in 2008 after averaging 18.8 points and 7.0 rebounds per game that season. She was also first-team Super State and all-conference as a sophomore. As a freshman, Edwards was first-team All-State in Class B and was third-team Super State. During her varsity career, Crete has posted a 51-5

record as she averaged 16.8 points per game. Edwards is also Crete's all-time leading scorer.

"Katelyn is a very versatile guard who has incredible athleticism," Williams said. "Katelyn's athleticism adds another dimension offensively and defensively to our basketball program. We love her size and her ability to score all over the floor as well as guard numerous positions. Katelyn is a flat-out winner and we are excited for her to bring that mentality to Coyote basketball."

Robertson, a 6-foot-2 senior forward at Grand Island High School, is in the midst of an outstanding prep career. She was named the Co-MVP of the Miss Basketball Showcase last summer as well as being one of the All-Americans at the event. Robertson averaged 20.5 points per game for the Nebraska Twisterz summer team at the event. She was named to the Lincoln-Journal Star Super State second team in 2009 after averaging 16.7 points and eight rebounds as a junior at Grand Island. She was a Super State second team selection in 2008, and was also named Nebraska AP Class A All-State second team.

She is a two-time Heartland Athletic Conference All-Conference selection (2008 and 2009). Robertson shared the Dakota Showcase MVP honors with Edwards. Robertson was also voted Player of the Year Midwest for the Summer of 2009 by the Midwest Recruiting Service.

"Stacia is an exceptional post who is going to have a great career in a Coyote uni-

form," Williams said. "She is a 6-2 post who possesses great strength along with an ability to really run. She is very tough to guard because of her ability to shoot the three and put the ball on the floor. Her scoring ability and physicality inside will be a fun weapon to utilize."

Robertson and Edwards have played on the same club team since they were in sixth grade.

Barden, a 5-foot-11 senior guard at Sturgis (S.D.) High School, has put together an impressive playing career. As a junior in 2008-09, Barden averaged 15.2 points, 5.3 rebounds, 5.6 assists and 3.1 steals per game. She is a two-time Class AA All-State selection, earning the honors in both 2008 and 2009. She was also named to Greater Dakota Conference All-Conference first team in both 2008 and 2009. She was also named a 2009 All-American by Miss Basketball Showcase. She was also named to the All-State tournament team in 2009 and was a four-time All-Greater Dakota Conference member. She was also named to the Argus Leader's 2nd Five in 2009, along with earning Best of the West Award honors from the Rapid City Journal in 2009.

"It is always great to get a standout from the state and Carsey is just that," Williams said. "Carsey is a 5-11 guard who has great shooting range and a very good skill set. Because of Carsey's size, she can play all three guard spots and be a tough matchup for opponents. We also love the fact that she makes those playing around her better. She has great vision and court awareness."
