USD cross country teams place second at conference meet

The University of South Dakota cross country teams both finished second at the Summit League Championships on Saturday with a second place finish by Jeff Mettler (Eureka, SD) in the men's race and a sixth place finish by Megan Hilson (Yankton) on the women's side.

Mettler and Hilson led a contingent of seven Coyotes who earned all-conference honors at the meet. Freshmen Mubarik Musa (Worthington, MN) and Amber Eickhorn (Wichita, KS) were also named conference newcomers of the year on top of earning all-conference status.

South Dakota State won the eight-team men's race with 35 points. South Dakota had 62, IUPUI had 104, Oakland had 111 and Western Illinois tallied 119 to finish in the top-five. The women's race was won by North Dakota State with 36 points. South Dakota's 59, South

Dakota State's 63, Oakland's 114 and Omaha's 157 rounded out the top-five in the nine-team field.

Mettler crossed the finish line of the 8k race in a time of 25:10.6, which was four seconds behind race winner Michael Krsnak of South Dakota State. Ethan Marquardt (Albert Lea, MN) placed seventh in 25:49.1 and Musa (Worthington) was eighth in 25:58.8.

Mettler and Marquardt were named first-team all-conference, while Musa earned second-team all-conference honors.

Isaac Allen (Lincoln, NE) finished 22nd in 26:43.5, and Alex Hohenthaler (Yankton) was 23rd in 26:44.1. Brant Haase (Lemmon, SD) crossed the finish line in 26:55.8 and Benson Langat (Kapsabet, Kenya) crossed in 27:23.9 to finish in 28th and 40th, respectively.

Hilson earned first-team all-conference with her sixth place finish in 22:23.7. Her time was about 34 seconds behind race winner Brittini Hutton of Oakland (21:49.8).

Three Coyote women made second-team all-conference, led by Eickhorn's 11th place finish in 22:51.0. Katie Wetzstein's (Hudson, WS) 12th place in 22:54.4 and Ali Gress' (Papillion, NE) 14th place in 22:57.7 also earned second-team honors.

Carol Miller (Mead, NE) had a strong finish with a 16th in 23:05.4, Jessica Brandli (Rapid City) finished 24th in 23:30.8 and Britni Waller (Lincoln, NE) was 25th in 23:31.1.

The Coyotes are next scheduled to race at the NCAA Midwest Regional on Nov. 10 in Springfield, MO.

USD finishes third at ISU double dual

The University of South Dakota women's swimming and diving team lost twice at Friday night's double-dual, falling to both Iowa State and Nebraska in Ames, Iowa.

Iowa State beat USD 246-53 while the Cornhuskers beat South Dakota 240-59.

Shannon Mocerri led the Coyotes with a second-place finish in the 100 meter breaststroke. Mocerri also finished fifth in the 200 meter breaststroke, clocking 2:24.58 and finishing in fifth place.

The Coyotes lost 240-59 to Nebraska and 246 to 53 to Iowa State. USD's Cassie Kimmes' strong outing in the 1,000-yard freestyle led to a fourth-place finish, South Dakota's second-best finish on the night.

USD volleyball tops Kansas City in four sets

After losing the first set, the University of South Dakota volleyball team won three straight sets to drop Kansas City 23-25, 25-21, 25-22, 25-17 in Summit League action on Friday night.

The Coyotes (11-14, 5-8) had strong play at the net with Kendall Krittenbrink (Gretna, NE) recording 19 kills and Melissa Firtko (Racine, WS) tallying eight kills and eight blocks. The Coyotes recorded 12.5 blocks and had 11 less

attack errors (31-20) than the Kangaroos (15-11, 7-6).

Kim Bulaga (Crystal Lake, IL) and Sydney Dimke (Ham Lake, MN) added to the attack with nine kills, while Natalie Walseth (Inver Grove Heights, MN) rounded out the balanced attack with seven kills. Tori Kroll (Germantown, WS) had 45 assists.

Riley Haug (Gretna) led the defense with 23 digs and Bulaga had 20 digs.

Kansas City had three

players record at least 10 kills. Skyler Muff and Emma Hagedorn both recorded 14 kills, while Emily Lucas had 12 kills. Taryn Miller had 25 digs in the loss.

The Coyotes split the season series with UMKC, and kept their conference tournament hopes alive for the weekend. South Dakota State (15-9, 7-5) topped Oakland 3-1 to pass Kansas City for the third spot in the conference. Oakland (13-11, 6-6) and North Dakota State

(10-14, 6-6) are both a half game behind Kansas City for the fourth and final spot in the conference tournament. USD is two wins back of Kansas City with three matches left.

South Dakota will host South Dakota State next Friday at 7 p.m. and North Dakota State for Senior Day on Nov. 4 at 2 p.m. They will finish the season at Omaha on Nov. 10.

USD men's cross country ranked 15th in the Midwest

The South Dakota men's cross country team is ranked 15th in the Midwest Region according to the United States Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) polls released on Monday.

It is the first time the Coyote men have been ranked in a

Division I poll. The Coyote women were ranked 15th in the women's Midwest Region poll earlier this season.

The ranking comes after the men finished second at the Summit League Championships on Saturday. That meet's winner, South Dakota State, is currently ranked 11th in the

same poll.

The poll is currently led by Oklahoma State. South Dakota has competed against many of the region's ranked teams this season, seeing #7 Iowa State, #8 Minnesota, #11 SDSU and #13 Iowa in at least one meet this season.

Both Coyote teams will be at

the NCAA Midwest Regional on Nov 10 in Springfield, MO.

Bell leads Indiana State past South Dakota

Terre Haute, IN—Indiana State junior running back Shakir Bell ran for 150 yards and scored three touchdowns to pace the 18th-ranked Sycamores to a 45-14 win against South Dakota Saturday at Memorial Stadium.

Bell scored from 2- and 4-yards out in the first half to help

ISU build a 28-0 halftime lead. He added a 25-yard touchdown reception near the end of the third quarter that made it 38-7. It was the sixth 100-yard rushing effort for Bell in nine games this season.

The Sycamore defense ran two interceptions back for touchdowns and held South

Dakota to 84 yards of total offense through three quarters. Jasper Sanders' 5-yard touchdown run on the Coyotes'

first possession of the third quarter ended a string of seven consecutive scoreless quarters for South Dakota.
