USD women's basketball signs first players of 2013-14 recruiting class

Women's basketball coach Amy Williams is pleased to announce the signings of Bridget Arens and Jaylah Jackson to the University of South Dakota's 2013-14 recruiting class on Friday.

Arens, a native of Crofton, NE, is a six-foot post player who averaged 16.1 points and seven rebounds last season as a junior at Crofton High School. Jackson, a native of Olathe, Kan., is a 5-foot-7-inch guard at Olathe Northwest High School and earned Class 6A

honorable mention honors last season.

"We're excited to have both Bridget and Jaylah sign with South Dakota," said Williams. "Both are excellent players who came from well-respected programs with great coaches."

Arens led Crofton to a Nebraska C2 State Championship last season, and was named a first-team all-state player. She spent last summer playing AAU basketball with the Pinnacle Bank Nebraska All-Stars.

"Bridget's a workhorse and a versatile

player," said Williams. "She's the definition of Coyote basketball. She's got a great work ethic and is not afraid to get in and score or rebound."

Jackson averaged 11 points, 4.3 rebounds, and 2.2 steals per game last season. An all-state selection as a sophomore, she helped Olathe Northwest to a second-place finish at the state tournament in her junior season.

"Jaylah's a game-changer," Williams said. "She's a strong guard who has strength and size and can handle the ball

well. She can score the ball in a lot of different ways and the energy she plays with is contagious."

Jackson helped the Missouri Valley Blazers Elite team to a record of 20-7 this past summer.

Both players will be playing for a program that has reached two postseason tournaments in four seasons at the Division I level.

USD swimming and diving swept at SDSU

The South Dakota swimming and diving teams fell to South Dakota State on Friday with the women dropping a 178-118 decision and the men losing 189-108.

Mariah Anderson and Shannon Moceri were winners in three events at the meet. After the two teamed up with Hannah Vesilek and Kaitlyn Jefferson to swim a 4:01.4 to win the 400 medley, Anderson swept both backstroke races. She won the 100 backstroke in 1:01.44 and the 200 backstroke in 2:12.31.

Moceri took both breaststroke races. She clocked in at 1:05.84 to win the 100 breaststroke and in 2:26.10 to win the 200 breaststroke.

On the men's side, Ian Ford won the 200 backstroke in 1:55.61 and Colin Krysl won the 100 butterfly in 51.62. Marcus Christianson, Roger White, Jake Tempesta and Nathan Tystahl all notched a win in the 200 freestyle relay with a time of 1:32.19.

South Dakota recorded several second-place finishes. Maggie Smith finished second in the 100

backstroke (1:02.10), Jefferson was second in the 50 freestyle (24.89) and Paige Stavely was second in the 200 backstroke (2:13.76). Vesilek added a second in the 100 butterfly with a time of 1:01.02.

Ford claimed three second-place finishes in the men's races. Individually, he swam a time of 52.91 in the 100 backstroke and 2:00.48 in the 200 IM. He worked with Tempesta, Krysl and Alex Guelcher to place second in the 400 medley in 3:35.73

Both teams had 200 freestyle relay teams place second as well. The women's team of Jefferson, Chelsea Coneset, Torie Buberl and Anderson clocked in at 1:39.22, while the men's team of Fisher Moller, Roland Henry, Jay Nelson and Nathanael Hardy finished in 1:32.32.

In diving results, Megan Chmielewsi finished second in both one-meter and three-meter dives. Dustin Gens was the top finisher for the men in both with a pair of thirds.

South Dakota will next be at the Rochester Invitational in Minnesota on Dec. 1.

Bench scoring lifts Northern Iowa past USD, 63-50

The Northern Iowa Panthers got 32 points from the bench to top the University of South Dakota's women's basketball team 63-50 Thursday, Nov. 15, in the McLeod Center.

Panther post player Jen Keitel scored 18 of those bench points to give UNI (1-1) a 32-14 lead in that stat. South Dakota (1-2) spent much of the second half trailing by double digits in the second half.

South Dakota's Nicole Seekamp (Renmark, Australia) had 12 points and five rebounds to lead the Coyote effort. Alexis Yackley (Onida, SD) tallied six points, seven boards and three assists, while Polly Harrington (Kansas City, MO) added eight points.

South Dakota outscored the Panthers in the second half 30-27 by shooting 40.7 percent (11-27), which was up from 21.4 percent (6-28) in the first. The Coyotes put UNI in foul trouble for most of the second half, drawing UNI's seventh fouls with 13:19 left in the half. However, USD was never able to trim a 36-20 halftime lead to less than nine (39-30 with 13:41 left).

Northern Iowa's Jacqui Kalin

scored 10 of her 15 points in the second half, while Keitel added eight-second half points.

Despite the low shooting percentage in the first half, South Dakota held a 7-5 edge in offensive rebounds, four of which coming from Tempestt Wilson (Elk River, Minn.). South Dakota also limited turnovers with only six in that half.

UNI capitalized on USD's first-half struggles by shooting 50 percent (14-28) in that half. The Panthers shot 39.7 percent in the game.


