Mueller honored at the SDSSA Awards Banquet

John Mueller had great enthusiasm for soccer, serving as coach, VYSL board member, SDSSA board member and referee for more than a decade. He was an active participant in many facets of the game until he became ill with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease) in October of 2010 and could no longer serve

the sport in the manner in which he was accustomed. From this point forward, he became an advocate and fan from the sidelines. Mueller passed away on Oct. 27, 2012. On Nov. 17 in Sioux Falls, at the South Dakota State Soccer Association Awards Banquet, Mueller was inducted into the

South Dakota State Soccer Hall of Fame. His wife, Michele and daughter Rosalie attended the banquet and receive two plaques that night. The first plaque was for Mueller's induction into the hall of fame. The second was an "In Loving Memory" plaque commemorating his years of service to the sport.

USD wins over Culver-Stockton, 81-73

Juevol Myles' game-high 24 points led four University of South Dakota players who scored in double figures as the Coyotes defeated Culver-Stockton, 81-73, Nov. 23 in USD's home opener at the DakotaDome.

Marshawn Norris scored a season-high 23 points for the Wildcats (4-2), which entered the game with a three-game winning streak. Mario Gulley and Austin Keaton had 13 and 12 points, respectively.

South Dakota center Trevor Gruis had 16 points and 10 rebounds in notching his first double-double of the season and ninth of his career. Karim Rowson finished one rebound shy of a double-double and had 13 points. Steve Tecker had 11 points and five rebounds.

South Dakota (2-3) led 42-37 at halftime and enjoyed its

largest lead at 71-54 with less than nine minutes to play. One of Norris' five triples capped a 9-0 run that brought the lead back to single digits with 5:30 remaining. The Wildcats got as close as six points, 74-68, two minutes later, but would draw no closer.

Culver-Stockton, an NAIA program from Canton, MO, kept close by forcing South Dakota into 22 turnovers and getting 14 second-chance points off 15 offensive rebounds. Gulley had three of the Wildcats' 10 steals.

Myles scored 12 points in each half. He was 8-of-13 from the field and 5-of-6 from behind the arc in 37 minutes of work. Norris was 5-of-16 from 3-point range while the rest of the Wildcats combined to go 3-of-16. Norris shot 9-of-24 overall.

Sanders earns MVFC All-Newcomer Team status

University of South Dakota junior running back/return specialist Jasper Sanders has been named to the Missouri Valley All-Newcomer Team as announced Tuesday by the league office.

Sanders, a native of Kansas City, KS, was the conference's second-leading kick returner in league play with a 26.7-yard average and carried a 7.1-yard average on nine punt returns. Sanders was also USD's third-leading rusher with 264 yards and three touchdowns on 81 attempts and third on the team with 12 receptions.

Prior to transferring to South Dakota, Sanders spent two years at Butler Community College, where he earned first-team all-conference and honorable mention All-American honors as a sophomore after leading the Grizzlies with 938 rushing yards and 15 touchdowns. As a freshman Sanders gained 506 yards on the ground on just 48 carries and added an additional seven touchdowns.

The team was selected by a panel of the league's coaches, sports information directors and members of the media. Twenty-three student-athletes were selected to the team.

Coyotes top Big East's Seton Hall, 71-55

The University of South Dakota women's basketball dropped Seton Hall 71-55 behind Nicole Seekamp's 20 points and Heidi Hoff's 16 points to record the program's first win over a Big East program.

The win gave South Dakota third-place in the Pepperdine Holiday Tournament, and moved the Coyotes to 2-4.

Seekamp and Hoff both recorded career-high point totals, while Polly Harrington came up one point short of a double-double with 13 rebounds and nine points. Alexis Yackley recorded a season-high five assists, as well as six points and four rebounds.

USD's bench, led by Hoff, outscored the Pirate bench 33-3. Margaret McCloud also came off the bench to add seven points and four rebounds.

Despite losing, Seton Hall (2-4) had four players reach at least 10 points. Ka-Deidre Simmons had 14 points, Alexis Brown had 13 points, and Brittany Morris had 12 points. Alexandra Maseko had 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Before Seton Hall, South Dakota had beaten only one school currently in the Big East. USD beat Notre Dame twice, topping the Irish 76-61 at home on Jan. 14, 1980, and again 67-60 at Notre Dame on Nov. 22, 1980.
