# Lavin crowned State A cross-country champ

Saturday in Rapid City saw some great performances by area runners. All three classes of the girls' state cross-country meet were won by runners within a 30-mile section of Highway 50. Annie Kruse from Yankton won the AA crown, Laura Nelson of Gayville-Volin secured the B title, and Maddie Lavin brought home the State A championship for Vermillion.

The 4,000-meter course made two laps of the hilly course. The added hills over the Elks course that was originally scheduled to be run played into the hands of these young ladies.

All three champs were able to push the pace, forcing other top runners to drop back. Some of these other runners have wonderful kicks, so a flatter course would have left them more energy for final kicks.

As it turned out, the best performances were recorded by those runners with the grit to fight through the tougher hills.

Annie Kruse (14:03.31) won by 21 seconds over Tamera Gorman (14:24.81) from Rapid City Stevens. Defending champ, Savannah Woods of Yankton was third with a time of 14:55.01. Laura Nelson (15:06.03) won by an amazing 33 seconds over teammate and defending champ Genevieve Clark (15:39.98).

Lavin (14:45.38) won the closest race of the day with a two second victory over Mattie Shirley-Fairbair (14:47.38) of Lead-Deadwood. Nicolette Schmidt (14:49.98) of Redfield/Doland was only two more seconds back.

Getting off to a great start, Lavin quickly moved to the front of the pack in the first quarter mile. She practically led wire to wire.

"We were expecting her closest competitors to be Hailey Streff and Emily Hawkes of Madison, but that was not the case," said Coach Kelly Fischbach. "Maddie had shaken them before the halfway point."

A pair of seventh-graders from Lead-Deadwood and Redfield/Doland, Mattie Shirley-Fairbair and Nicolette Schmidt respectively, did come up to challenge the solitary Tanager. They drew even with Lavin with about 400 meters to go, but last years runner-up out-kicked them for the victory.

Maddie was "ecstatic" about the race, according to her interview with KVHT radio immediately following her finish.

Coach Fischbach could not see the finish line, so she had an anxious 10-minute search to find out how her star runner had done. Finally rescued by other local coaches from USD and YHS, she could celebrate with the Lavin family.

Coach Fischbach was happy with the course, which provided many spectator-friendly places to watch the course.

"They had paths cut through areas of tall weeds, so people could easily get from one side of the course to the other," she said.

With the course being in good condition, she concluded that Robbinsdale Park was probably a better venue than the originally scheduled Elks course.

"I am super proud of her," said Coach Fischbach about Maddie Lavin. "She ran her little heart out, and was deserving of the title. She is very deserving, and a very talented athlete with a bright future ahead of her."

# Tanagers shock top seed Dakota Valley

The number four seeded Vermillion Tanagers shocked the first seeded Dakota Valley Panthers 8-0 in chilly, rainy 11A District two playoff action Tuesday evening in North Sioux City at Dakota Valley High School.

Vermillion earned their first playoff victory since 2007, and their first under new head coach Andy Homan.

"This is great," Homan said. "What an awesome opportunity to get a playoff win, especially for the guys, they worked extremely hard out there tonight."

The Tanagers (2-7) were defeated by Dakota Valley (5-4) 19-22 just three weeks prior to their playoff contest.

However, with preparation and tightening up the screws, the

Tanagers were able to pull off the upset.

"I told the guys, we can play as long as we want to," Holman said. "If we want to be done now, we can. But if we want to keep playing this game, we can do the little things right."

The weather conditions played in favor of the run heavy Tanagers.

The first half was a defensive juggernaut, ending at a 0-0 tie.

The first half was headlined by two turnovers back-to-back for both teams.

With 7:43 left in the first quarter, sophomore Tanager quarterback Matt Ouellette threw it up for grabs and senior safety Chavez Madden snagged an interception.

The next drive, senior Panther quarterback Alex Fernando threw a curl route to wide-out Brody VanGinkel, but

Tanager linebacker Tanager linebacker Tyler Madsen read the pass, and intercepted the ball.

As the Tanagers were marching, they decided to line up and kick a field goal with 5:03 left in the half.

The 39 yard field goal was blocked by Blake Perryman.

The Panthers were unable to take advantage of the missed kick.

Both teams combined to have 86 total yards of offense in the first half.

To start the second half, senior kicker Ethan James booted the ball down to the 15, where the ball bounced off of a Panther receiver, which was then recovered by Vermillion.

The next play saw junior running back Regan Bye run a 76 yard touchdown, but was called back on a holding call.

The Tanagers were able to connect, despite the errors on offense.

James booted a 44 yard field goal with 8:21 left in the third quarter, to give the Tanagers a 3-0 advantage.

"James has a pretty good leg that the college coaches haven't seen yet," Homan said. "This is his first year out, he's really a hidden talent."

With 1:50 left in the third, on a third down, Ouellette connected on a 37 yard pass to James to put the Tanagers inside the seven yard line.

A goal line stand by Dakota Valley ended the action in the fourth quarter.

With 14:56 left in the fourth quarter, James connected on a 25 yard field goal to give the Tanagers a slim 6-0 lead with the whole forth
