Top-ranked Madison powers past Tanagers

An inauspicious start for the Vermillion Tanagers set the tone for the remainder of the game. On the first play of the game, quarterback Carter Kratz fumbled the ball, recovering it for a loss of five yards on their way to a 54-11 loss to the top-seeded 11A Madison Bulldogs. The victory sends Madison to the third round of the playoffs this Saturday, and Vermillion home for another offseason.

Despite the tough loss, Vermillion head coach Andy Homan said he was impressed with the effort he saw from his team.

"I think they did good," Homan said. "You come out of

halftime like that when you're down – the kids could've just gave up – but they kept fighting the whole time.

The Tanagers allowed an early Bulldog touchdown following a botched punt but managed to hold them to seven points in the first quarter. Then, without even taking a full minute off the clock in the second quarter, the Bulldogs tacked on two more touchdowns; once on a 75 yard carry by Rush Milne, the other coming after Vermillion QB Carter Kratz was picked off by Isaac Schubert of the Bulldogs. Milne would end the night with 207 yards and five touchdowns.

An Ethan James field goal put the Tanagers on the board with 4:21 left in the first half. By halftime, the Bulldogs had taken

a 41-3 lead. Vermillion had a net loss of 18 yards on the ground in the first half, only managing to gain back eight of them by the end of the game.

With Madison threatening once again late in the 3rd quarter, the Tanagers spring to life, forcing a Madison fumble which was recovered by Vermillion's Regan Bye and returned 85 yards for the Tanagers first and only touchdown.

The game was the end of Vermillion's playoff run a week after defeating Dakota Valley 8-0 in the first round. In total, the Tanagers were out-gained offensively 485 yards to 125.

Coach Homan noted that ultimately, the game was a win-win for the school, despite the score, following the team's

surprise success of the first round.

"I just told them to come out here and play," he said. "We're not supposed to be here anyways, if we lose, we lose, if not then we did another great upset. It was a win-win for us."

Homan emphasized there were many positives the team will build on from this season.

"Offensively, we put up some yards, defensively, we played some good games," he said. "It's just the little things we need to fix going into next year. We're just going to keep building on as a team."

March of the Penguins: YSU rallies past Coyotes

Close losses have not been a rare occurrence for the USD football team.

Defensive performances like Saturday, Nov. 2, are, in short, rather uncommon.

What Youngstown State did to the Coyotes in a 38-34 Missouri Valley Football Conference victory was something no other team had done in the DakotaDome this season.

USD (4-5, 3-3) had allowed an average of 12 points and 213 yards in three games at home. Opponents had also only completed 31 percent on third down.

Youngstate State, however, rolled up 517 yards and were 9-of-15 on third down.

"That's way too many," USD senior cornerback Jarrid Bryant said. "We've been pretty consistent; that was probably the worst game we've played."

The previous high for opposing offenses against the Coyote defense was 190 yards passing and 398 total yards — both at Northern Iowa.

Youngstown State eclipsed both Saturday, thanks to 283

yards passing from quarterback Kurt Hess.

"We're better than that on defense," USD head coach Joe Glenn said. "I think we're all disappointed we couldn't make some of those plays."

The one scheme Glenn pointed to specifically in his post-game interview was the dive run by the Penguins. YSU ran 51 times for an average of 4.6 yards

per carry, led by 131 yards and two touchdowns from freshman Martin Ruiz.

"We had practiced the veer dive all week," Glenn said. "They down block and you have to slide down and you have to get the guy."

"We didn't do a good job of that."

The veteran coach also pointed to the same play

Youngstown State ran in last season's meeting in Ohio.

"We knew they were going to run it and we just didn't get the dive shut down," Glenn said.

The biggest drive of the game — the last one for the Penguins — proved to be the most damaging for the Coyotes. Hess was 3-of-4 with completions of 18, 10 and 15 yards, and YSU was helped by a USD 15-yard late hit out of bounds penalty.

Asked about that last drive, Coyote senior linebacker Tyler Starr, who had one of USD's four sacks on the day, called the defense "soft."

"I thought maybe we could have attacked them more," Starr said. "You can't let a quarterback like that sit back there and let it open up."

"When it came to it, their offense out-played our defense."

Playoff Chances All But Over With Youngstown State handing USD its fifth loss of the season, the Coyotes are all but out of FCS playoff contention.

And the players were aware of that after Saturday's game.

"Probably one of the worst, just because it's most likely going to knock us out of a playoff
