Mayor Powell stated that the Vermillion Now! 2 Program includes an Advisory Governance Council consisting of major cash investors as was done for Vermillion Now! 1. Mayor Powell stated that the Advisory Governance Council provides campaign oversight, accountability, and transparency for campaign dollars. Mayor Powell noted that he was the City representative for Vermillion Now! 1 and would be willing to serve as the City representative for Vermillion Now! 2.
