"I knew from the other PATs and field goals that I was getting a pretty good push, and that last one, I just got a little more and gave it a little extra," Iddings said.

For a program that had endured its share of near misses and rough losses in the Missouri Valley, making the kind of clutch plays like USD did Saturday was certainly proof that experience matters.

Put another way, paraphrasing Glenn: Sometimes the lows make the highs all the more sweeter.

"I think you can play better in a game like this when we've had your hand held to the fire and you've seen the fire before," Glenn said.

"You have a little more confidence, a little more experience.'

That kind of tenure has guided USD's defense, in particular, this season. Having garnered praise for its second-half effort a week ago at Northern Iowa, the Coyote defense recorded four sacks, two interceptions and two fumbles against an explosive SIU offense.

Cornerback Mike Lilly, who had earlier been the victim of a 79-yard touchdown completion against him, intercepted lannotti at the 8:11 mark of the fourth quarter.

The Coyotes, however, couldn't capitzlize and punted the ball back to the Salukis. It was that takeaway that led to the final touchdown drive for the home team.

I asked a couple players during Monday's event if they felt the talk of reaching the NCAA Tournament seemed more realistic now than it did a year ago. I would imagine it would, right?

It wasn't some far off level the Coyotes would never reach. Not anymore. Not after last season when the program won a game in the postseason tournament.

"That's the beauty of college basketball," Smith said, smiling. "It's a chip and a chair.'

There had perhaps been that because the Summit League is right now a one-bid league, the need to win the conference tournament seemed daunting. The reality is, you simply need to play well at the right time. "When you get to the

conference tournament, all you have to do is win three games," Smith said. "Now, that's easy to say, but that's all you have to do.

"Go on a three-game winning streak and anything can happen."

What we've already started to see happen is Smith is building the program with a big-picture focus. He and his staff brought in four transfers after last season, and only one (Shy McClelland) is eligible this season.

The other three transfers, Matt Mooney (Air Force), Trey Dickerson (Iowa) and Carlton Hurst (Colorado

State) will be the foundations for the future, along with three freshmen this season and the 2016 recruiting class.

Starting with what he did last season and what he's setting up for the future, Smith is slowly but surely rising USD's regional profile. Success is going to have to be part of the discussion. That's why he was hired. That's why USD opened the checkbooks to land him.

The question now is, what can Smith and Co. do for an encore this season? Is the next step in progression to reach the Summit League championship game?

Working in the Coyotes favor is the lack of a learning curve under the new staff.

"Now we have even more pieces in place and a coaching staff that knows us better," Kasperbauer said, so I think the bar is going to be set even higher.'

# Meyer, Strang Named **To Summit League All-Tournament Team**

BROOKINGS, S.D.-South Dakota senior defender Kasha Meyer and junior striker Corey Strang were named to the 2015 Summit League All-Tournament team.

A senior defender hailing from Lincoln, Neb., Meyer anchored a young Coyote back line during the match. She played all 101 minutes of the match, putting numerous stops on the North Dakota State run game. Mever also continued to use her height to her advantage, winning headers off North Dakota State's crosses to clear the ball away from South Dakota defensive territory. Meyer came up for a South Dakota corner kick in the 83rd minute, sending a header shot just wide of the post. Two weeks ago in league matches against IUPUI and Western Illinois, Meyer put the game-winners into the back of the net off a pair of corner kicks.

A junior striker hailing from Temecula, Calif., Strang posted two goals and an assist in the semifinal match of the Summit League Tournament. In addition to setting up the equalizer with an assist, Strang made good on a penalty kick and scored a left-footer on a long bouncing ball from outside the box. With the five points from the match, Strang improved to third in league standings in goals (11) and points (27). Strang also tied for first in the league for penalty kicks made with three.

South Dakota (8-12-0, 5-3-0 Summit League) fell to top-ranked North Dakota State (13-6-1, 7-0-1 Summit League) 4-3 in double overtime of the Summit League semifinal match.
