The motion was seconded by Alderman Ward. Discussion followed and the question of the adoption of the Resolution was presented for a vote of the Governing Body. 7 members voted in favor of and 0 members voted in opposition to the Resolution. Mayor Christopherson declared that the Resolution was adopted.

D. Resolution to apply for a DENR grant/loan application for a new landfill bulldozer

Andy Colvin, Assistant to the City Manager, reported that the 2010 budget includes funding for the bulldozer and roll-off boxes in the Joint Powers landfill fund. The SDDENR has a program to provide grants and low interest loans to assist with these types of equipment purchases. The equipment is anticipated to cost \$485,000 and the request is to apply for an \$85,000 grant and \$200,000 2.5% loan with \$200,000 from Joint Powers landfill fund reserves.

Alderman Powell moved approval of the resolution authorizing the SDDENR \$85,000 grant and \$200,000 loan application for the landfill dozer and other landfill equipment. Alderman Willson seconded the motion. Motion carried 7 to 0. Mayor Christopherson declared the motion adopted.

E. Public Fireworks Display Permit - October 1, 2009 for High School Homecoming celebration

Mike Carlson, Finance Officer, reported that an application was received from Tom Taylor for the Vermillion High School homecom-

ing fireworks display on October 1st south of the high school at 8:00 p.m.

This has been done for a number of years and the High School Principal has included a letter with the request.

Alderman Ward moved approval of the public fireworks display permit for the display at the Vermillion High School on October 1, 2009 by Tom Taylor. Alderman Edelen seconded the motion. Motion carried 7 to 0. Mayor Christopherson declared the motion adopted.

F. Selection of a Storm sewer drainage study project consultant

Jose Dominguez, City Engineer, reported that, in the joint meetings between the City Council and Planning Commission regarding this update to the comprehensive plan, there was discussion on the ability to serve area outside the city limits with utilities. Jose stated that he requested proposals from consulting engineers to study the storm drainage system's ability to serve the growth areas to the north and east. Four proposals were received and reviewed using a selection criteria form that assigned points to cost, experience and methodology. Based upon these criteria, it is recommended that the firm of Howard R. Green be hired for this work. The cost is a not to exceed the amount of \$6,000 that will be funded from the storm water fee fund. Jose noted that this was not included in the budget so a supplemental appropriation ordinance will be needed. Discussion followed on the proposals.

Alderman Willson moved approval of contracting with Howard R. Green for the storm drainage study in the amount of \$6,000. Alderman French seconded the motion. Discussion followed. Motion carried 7 to 0. Mayor Christopherson declared the motion adopted.

G. Surplus landfill truck

Andy Colvin, Assistant the City Manager, reported that City staff is requesting the surplus of the 1987 Mach truck at the Landfill. The truck needs repairs in excess of the value, thus the request to surplus.

Alderman French moved approval of declaring the 1987 Mach truck surplus and authorizing the appraisal by the Surplus Appraisal Committee with the truck to be sold by sealed bids.

Alderman Willson seconded the motion. Motion carried 7 to 0. Mayor Christopherson declared the motion adopted.

10. City Manager's Report
A. John reported that the household hazardous waste collection would be on Friday, October 2nd from 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm at the Recycling Center, 840 N. Crawford Road. The charge is \$10 per vehicle to dispose of household waste. On Saturday, October 3rd the program will be in Yankton from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm. If there are any questions, please contact the Recycling Center.
B. John reported that the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure is this Sunday, September 27th and there will be temporary street closures beginning at 9:00 am as the race progresses. The racers will be on Clark, Plum, Main, High and Dakota Streets.
C. John reported that the City would be participating in the Vermillion High School volunteer day on Tuesday, September 29th. Students will be completing litter pickup, tree branch removal in the parks, and helping with projects at the Fire Station and City Hall.
D. John invited the community to the Light & Power Open House at the Municipal Service Center, 115 West Duke Street on Tuesday, October 6th from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm and the Fire/EMS Open House at the William J Radigan Fire/EMS Station, 840 North Dakota on Wednesday, October 7th from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm.
E. John noted that Phyllis Packard was going to give an update on the curbside recycling but she is ill tonight so he will report from her notes. Based upon the first two weeks, it is projected that there is 30% participation, which is great for a program just getting started. A big thanks to all the citizens that are participating in the program. About 6,000 pounds of material was collected each week of which 400 pounds was aluminum and 800 pounds was cardboard. He noted that the blue bins were delivered last week and that a few glitches have been reported that are being worked out. If there are any questions, please contact City Hall. Again, he thanked the citizens for their participation that is making the program so successful at the start.
