In the 30 minutes between walking off the court and emerging from the makeshift locker room, the University of South Dakota volleyball team held an intense, wide-ranging impromptu meeting.

The second place-team in the Summit League, IUPUI, continued the frustration for the Coyotes by winning 25-12, 20-25, 25-17, 25-21 on Friday at the DakotaDome.

"At this level in college athletics, you absolutely need to play tough and motivated every single time," head coach Matt Houk said after the extended post-match chat.

"That's what we talked about, that we're repeating things that create failure, not success."

Dropping to 0-4 at their new "Den" on the second level of the dome, the Coyotes had their sixth straight match with a sub-.200 attack percentage (at .126). The first set Friday was even worse, at negative.027, allowing the Jaguars to roll. The Coyotes — mirroring their season to this point — responded by a

strong second set, hitting .366 and taking the Jaguars out of system. If only USD could duplicate that effort every time, according to senior setter Bailey Lupardus, who was

recorded 32 assists. "I definitely feel we'll be a better team next time," Lupardus said. "We'll change what we need to change, and

"She can really play about anywhere, plus it's nice to have another hitter," Lupardus said of Kroll. "I definitely don't mind it; I love being out there to help out."


She and her teammates will get
