

Moore named New Librarian of the Year

Congress to Campus at USD Oct. 29-30

Joyce Moore, Vermillion Public Library, was named New Librarian of the Year at the recent annual conference of the South Dakota Library Association.

The W.O. Farber Center for Civic Leadership and the University of South Dakota Political Science League welcomes former South Dakota Rep. Stephanie Hersth Sandlin; her husband and former Congressman Max Sandlin, D-Texas; and former Florida Rep. Dan Miller to the USD campus, Oct. 29-30, for Congress to Campus.

A graduate of Groton High School, Hersth Sandlin earned a B.A. and a Juris Doctor from Georgetown University, and was a law clerk for both the 4th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals and the U.S. District Court for the District of South Dakota.

Hersth Sandlin, Sandlin and Miller on campus a week before the election is a tremendous opportunity for our students as these members frequently provide candid views on contemporary public policies, issues and political leaders."

The New Librarian of the Year recognizes librarians who are just getting started in the library profession - particularly those individuals who project a dynamic image of the professional librarian, who offer the community something that it didn't have before, and who have transformed a routine task or untried idea into imaginative, creative service.

Herseth Sandlin currently serves as General Counsel and Vice President for Corporate Development for Raven Industries, Inc. Prior to joining Raven, she was a Partner at Olsson Frank Weeda Terman Matz PC in Washington, D.C., representing clients on legislative and regulatory matters concerning technology and innovation in agriculture, bioenergy and manufacturing.

Sandlin is a partner, co-chairman, and general counsel of Mercury and Mercury/Clark & Weinstock, and leads the government relations and public strategies team in Washington, D.C. He served eight years in the U.S. House of Representatives (1997-2005) representing Texas' 1st Congressional District.

Miller returned to academia. In 2003, he was a Fellow at the Institute of Politics at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. He is currently teaching at the University of South Florida and is developing the Manasota Institute of Public Policy and Leadership at the Sarasota Campus of USF.

Miller and Sandlin will present the Farber Forum, "The Role of Congress in the War on Terror," at 4 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 29 at Farber Hall, inside Old Main, while the Sandlins will present a second Farber Forum, "Past, Present and Future of Congress," at 10:45 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 30 at Farber Hall.

Nominators praised Moore for her creative development of new services and for her excellent customer service.

From 2004-2011, Herseth Sandlin served in the represented South Dakota's At-Large District in the United States House of Representatives. Prior to serving four terms in the U.S. House of Representatives, she was executive director of the South Dakota Farmers Union Foundation, taught courses on government and politics at Augustana College and South Dakota State University, and was an Associate at Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom L.L.P. in Washington, D.C.

Prior to his service in Congress, Sandlin practiced law in Texas and had a broad-based litigation and business practice. He was active in the banking industry and served for a decade on the board of directors of a local bank, and also served as a county judge and county court at law judge in Texas.

All three former members of the United States House of Representatives will present on behalf of the Farber Forum, meet with faculty and students and attend select political science and government classes during the two-day Congress to Campus event.

In addition to the presentations, all three former members of Congress will be present on Oct. 30 for Richardson's Political Theory class. They will also attend classes taught by Political Science Instructor Mary Pat Bierle on Oct. 29, including Introduction to American Government and Political Writing.

The South Dakota Library Association is a statewide organization representing libraries, library employees, library trustees and library supporters.

Married to former South Dakota Congresswoman Stephanie Hersth Sandlin since 2007, Sandlin is a native of Texarkana, Texas, and received both his bachelor's degree and Juris Doctor from Baylor University.
