

ing (quarterback) Ryan (Saeger) leading them down the field, and confidence of everyone in front of me," Bergner said.

Bergner improved to 9-of-16 on field goals this season, and remains a perfect 20-of-20 on extra points. His first field goal Saturday of 53 yards was also a personal best, but he was quick to acknowledge his blockers.
