HURON, S.D. — Three per-cent of South Dakotans want to "head for the border," according to a poll conducted by South Dakota Magazine during a 30th anniversary "Fair Tour" in August and September, but most of the respondents are tickled to be living here.

The magazine's Yankton staff conducted the "Happiness Poll" at the Turner County Fair in Parker, Central States Fair in Rapid City and the State Fair in Huron, which just concluded.

Ashley Wagner, the magazine's circulation director and unofficial poll statistician, said there were no statistical differences between the three sites. "Everywhere we went, we found that except for a few soreheads people are pretty happy with their lives in South Dakota.'
